

"Footprints in the Sand"
I walked on a sandy area under the Nimitz Bridge, Liberty
Station, on February 28, 2024, during low tide. In the next few hours, high tide would have erased my footprints.

Likewise, in our daily walk, we leave behind some positive "footprints" impacting people we love or people we touched in our journey. Someday, our footprints on earth will be gone when our LORD calls us home.

I challenge you today:

- (1) Don't waste your life!
- (2) Make a difference to someone today!
- (3) Always Have an attitude of gratitude!
- (4) Offer help to someone today!
- (5) Share the Love of God!

"Footprints in the Snow"
By the time of writing (February 29, 2024), northern California is expecting up to ten feet of snow during the snowstorms. Other

places in the northwest are expecting blizzard conditions too.

Here are some lessons I learned about my personal experience during the winter snow season while serving our God and Country in my duty stations in 2007-2010 in Naval Station Newport, Rhode Island, and Naval Base Kitsap, in 2010-2013in Silverdale, WA.

First, capturing the brightness of the falling snow and snow on the ground is one of my favorite strategies in photography. There were times that the snow could be very bright, so I needed to wear sunglasses. The lightness of the snow was pure white and blinding. It reminds me of the Hebrew Scripture saying,

"Come now, and let us reason together," Says the Lord, "Though your sins are like scarlet,

They shall be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They shall be as wool. Isaiah 1:18 NKJV

Only God can perform a miracle of forgiveness if we answer His invitation and come to Him with a contrite heart asking Him for forgiveness. Only God can turn the darkest stain in our lives to the whitest living like the refreshing snowfall. Only God can turn our dirtiest deeds to cleanest conscience like turning the red stained wool to brightest white color.

Second, the powerful images of the snowflakes on the ground, the footprints, and the sun shining on them communicate a very important message for you and me:

The beautiful snow is here today, but someday it will be gone. It will ultimately melt away, evaporate, or sip through the ground. You may be enjoying life now (or suffering), nevertheless, we will all die sooner or later and disappear forever. Someone said that we can not avoid death and taxes. Well, sometimes taxpayers will find a way to avoid taxes, however, we will never avoid the end of life's journey on earth.

Third, Ask yourself, "What should I do while I am here on earth?"

- (1) Start each day right by asking God for help or forgiveness of your sins.
- (2) Believe in God (Jesus) in your heart.
- (3) Extend a helping hand to others in need.
- (4) Read your Bible and Pray every day.
- (5) Always Remember...God is GOOD ALL THE TIME.

Military Training Comes in Handy



You can never plan for a workday to go sideways, and that was certainly the case for RMS Senior Test Coordinator Deanna Smith on a late January day this year in the middle of the Pacific Ocean.

It was day three of Aegis combat systems modernization sea trials an RMS team was supporting on board the USS Pinckney (DDG 91). "I was on the mess deck with a couple teammates, late morning, when there was a medical emergency called over the 1MC, the ship's loudspeaker. Shortly after the announcement, the ship's captain came over the 1MC and asked if anyone had any experience with flight deck operations."

A Navy sailor was injured, and an aircraft carrier was in the area and was available to send a Sikorsky SH-60 helicopter to do a medical evacuation (medevac). The USS Pinckney crew needed assistance out on the flight deck because the ship was not certified for flight operations and there was minimal crew training on supporting a medevac.

Deanna had such training being a six-year Navy veteran who served as an SH-60F/H airedale – a sailor who flies in aircraft and works on flight decks – and as an aviation warfare operator. "Performing medevacs was a regular part of aviation warfare duty, so I had a great deal of experience in that area and was very comfortable assisting on the ship." Her Navy duty included a tour in Iraq as a door gunner which provided even more medevac know-how.

"I immediately went on the flight deck and helped them do the foreign objects detection (FOD) walk-down to make sure the area was clear. That proved to be a bit tricky because the crew wasn't quite sure which direction the helicopter would be coming from."

Deanna provided some flight deck safety training on the flight deck first before entering the hangar bay.

She then led the team on a walk-through of the helicopter basket process: how it is deployed, how to place the patient in the basket, and tying the individual down.

"When the helicopter arrived, two of the helicopter crew members hoisted themselves down on the deck, so they didn't have to send the basket up which would have been very dangerous." The injured sailor was brought aboard the helicopter and whisked to the carrier for treatment.

In all, Deanna spent nearly two hours leading the effort. "Fortunately, the sailor had a relatively minor injury, and she was back on land the next day, but it was important to do everything right. I'd do that for anybody. The Pinckney crew members were great. They listened and everybody stayed calm."

Her Lockheed Martin RMS teammates viewed all of the day's proceedings on monitors from the cameras stationed on the flight deck. "They kidded me afterwards, 'We didn't know you were going to go out there and take over.""

Just a couple days later, Deanna's manager, Teré Patterson, received an email:

Wanted to reach out and express our deepest gratitude for the help that Deanna Smith brought to the Pinckney team during a recent medevac event during Combat System Sea Trials #1. We had a sailor who required to be medevac'd off the ship and Deanna provided some relevant and timely training to my team regarding [search and rescue] efforts.

It is great to see some of that goodness alive and well as former Navy sailors transition to the other side and still bring it when it's needed.






