July 4th - Car Show & Independence Day Celebrations



Journey of an American Hero—Taking Kyle Home

Twenty years ago, on a Memorial Day weekend on 31 May 2010, I remember writing a brief story of Pfc., U.S. Marine Corps, Kyle Coutu, one of our heroes who gave his life for freedom, faith, flag, and family on February 26, 2010.

"Journey of an American Hero—Taking Kyle Home," recounts the solemn journey of Pfc. Kyle J. Coutu, a U.S. Marine who was killed in action during a major combat offensive against the Taliban in Helmand province, Afghanistan.

I described my emotional experience of accompanying Coutu's remains back to his hometown of Pawtucket, Rhode Island, where he was laid to rest at Exeter Veterans' Cemetery on February 26, 2010.

The article highlights Coutu's bravery, commitment, and faith, as well as the overwhelming support from his community, who lined the streets waving American flags to honor their fallen hero.

The piece serves as a Memorial Day tribute, reminding readers of the sacrifices made by service members and the deep gratitude owed to them and their families.

It concludes with a heartfelt recitation of the Marine Corps Prayer by Pfc. Peter Lang, Coutu's childhood friend and fellow Marine, who escorted his remains home.

Pfc. Lang, childhood schoolmate, fellow Marine, and best friend of Coutu, who escorted his remains home. As a final tribute . . . Lang

memorized in his mind and heart the Marine Corps Prayer . . . and solemnly recited:

'Almighty Father, whose command is over all and whose love never fails, make me aware of thy presence and obedient to thy will. Keep me true to my best self, guarding me against dishonesty in purpose and deed and helping me to live so that I can face my fellow Marines, my loved ones, and thee without shame or fear. Protect my family.

Give me the will to do the work of a Marine and to accept my share of responsibilities with vigor and enthusiasm. Grant me the courage to be proficient in my daily performance. Keep me loyal and faithful to my superiors and to the duties my country and the Marine Corps have entrusted to me. Help me to wear my uniform with dignity, and let it remind me daily of the traditions, which I must uphold.

If I am inclined to doubt, steady my faith; if I am tempted, make me strong to resist; if I should miss the mark, give me courage to try again.

Guide me with the light of truth and grant me wisdom by which I may understand the answer to my prayer. Amen.'


