FROM THE CANTEEN MANAGER


Did you feel the earthquake Monday, April 14? That's the question that invoked many stories after a 5.2 magnitude shaker hit the county, so I thought I'd share one here. I was at the Post taking care of some business when the guake happened. I was surprised by how much our old building shook and rattled, but surprisingly, there was no visible damage. Much of the canteen inventory had to be repositioned on the shelves as the shaker brought products to the edge of the shelf, but fortunately nothing fell. While I was straightening out the bottles behind the bar, I was contacted by the Commander for a status report. He mentioned he had noticed an interesting sight while reviewing our security cameras. In the liquor closet was a bottle of Kalua that went to the edge of the shelf and tipped over, but was stopped by a sleeping bag and backpack hanging on the wall (see photo below). The backpacks we keep are given to homeless veterans in need, and this one proved useful in a different way.

Easter brunch was well attended. There was a great variety of food to be enjoyed. A big Thank You goes out to the Commander, and the Kitchen volunteers including members of the Auxiliary who kept the serving line stocked and assisted in clean-up. Red Poppy Flower: Symbol of Sacrifice and Freedom

The red poppy is one of the most beautiful flowers that adorn the European and the Holy Land landscapes during springtime season. During my tour of duty on board Naval Support Activity Naples, Italy, in summer of 2013 to summer of 2016, I saw many red poppies decorated the southern Italy landscape. For me the red poppy has a patriotic meaning and spiritual symbol. Red symbolizes the blood of warriors who fought for freedom from the ancient era to modern times.


Every time you and I see each red poppy; it represents a precious soul of warrior/veteran who sheds his or her blood for the flag. We must never forget their sacrifices for freedom's sake.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Buddy Poppies program is a longstanding tradition that honors fallen service members and supports veterans in need. The poppy became the official memorial flower of the VFW in 1922, inspired by the famous poem *In Flanders Fields*.

Each year, VFW members distribute Buddy Poppies, often around Memorial Day and Veterans Day, to raise funds for veterans' rehabilitation programs, financial assistance, and the VFW National Home for Children. The poppies are assembled by disabled and needy veterans, providing them with financial support.

When you see a veteran on Veteran's Day or any day of the year, please tell him or her, "Thank You So much for your Service!" On the other hand, on Memorial Day, never forget to remember and honor those who died while serving in our Armed Forces. We must always acknowledge that Freedom is Not Free! For those who gave up everything in service to this Country. Our Lord said, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13 ESV. Jesus Christ gave His life for you and me. He shed His blood and died on the line of duty! He gave us eternal spiritual freedom from our enemies (Satan, sin and old sinful nature). Our brave warriors gave their lives for you and for me so that we can remain free from tyranny and oppression and continue to enjoy our freedom today. Let's pause a moment of silence and say a prayer of thanks for the service of our veterans, all our heroes, and their families. 


