

Thanksgiving and Lasting Memory of Tom McDonald Maston

When I was a seminary student at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (SWBTS), I was given the privilege of helping care for Tom McDonald "Tom Mc" Maston, the beloved son of Dr. T. B. Maston, a renowned ethicist, and his wife, Mae.

Tom Mc was born in 1925 with a severe physical disability caused by complications during delivery. Though confined to a wheelchair and unable to speak, he developed a simple yet profound way of communicating with his parents—a blink for "no" and an open mouth for "yes." What struck me most was not his limitation, but his joyful spirit. His smile was constant, his presence uplifting.

For 65 years, Dr. Maston and Mae lovingly cared for Tom Mc at home, choosing compassion over convenience, dignity over dismissal.

Their devotion was a living testimony of Christlike love. They even traveled with him across the United States and to Beirut, Lebanon— where they reminded me that while some cultures might hide their disabled family members, the Mastons chose instead to honor, cherish, and celebrate their son.

In the mid-1980s, I accompanied the family on a trip to Midland, Texas, where Dr. Maston was invited to speak at First Baptist Church. That journey, like every encounter with the Mastons, left a lasting impression on me.

The Mastons home was always open, their table always welcoming. I will never forget the Thanksgiving dinners were Tom Mc, his younger brother Eugene, and the Mastons' circle of helpers gathered in warmth and fellowship. It was my best Thanksgiving Celebration with Tom Mc and his family in Fort Worth, TX.

Tom Mc's longevity was not only a testament to medical care, but to the power of love, joy, and faithful devotion. His disability never silenced his smile, and his life never ceased to inspire. Though the Mastons have all gone on to glory, their Christian witness—and especially Tom Mc's radiant spirit—remains etched in my heart forever.

In his honor, I once named a Monarch butterfly, injured during its emergence, after Tom Mc. Like that butterfly, Tom Mc's life was marked by fragility, yet also by tenacity, beauty, and joy. His story reminds us that every life, no matter its challenges, reflects the image of God and carries a testimony of grace.

Inspiration:

Tom Mc's life teaches us that true strength is not measured by ability, but by joy in the face of adversity, and love that never gives up. His smile was his sermon, his life a witness, and his family's devotion a living parable of God's unfailing care.

The life of Tom Mc Maston reminds us that joy is not limited by ability, and love is not measured by strength. Surrounded by the faithful care of his family, Tom Mc's radiant smile testified that every life is precious in God's sight. His story challenges us to see beyond limitations and to embrace one another with Christlike compassion.

"The Smile That Preached"

In silence he spoke, in stillness he shone, Tom Mc, a life by grace alone. No pulpit, no voice, no worldly acclaim, Yet joy was his sermon, love bore his name. A blink for "no," an open mouth for "yes," Simple replies, yet hearts he'd bless. Confined to a chair, but never to sorrow, His smile lit each day with hope for tomorrow.

Mae and T. B., with hands full of care, Chose dignity daily, chose love to bear. They traveled the miles, they opened their door, Their table a haven, their hearts gave more.

Thanksgiving with Tom—oh, what a feast! Where joy was the guest, and grace never ceased. A butterfly broken, yet named with pride, Tom Mc's spirit in wings that defied.

His life was a mirror of heaven's embrace, A fragile frame filled with tenacious grace. Though gone to glory, his witness remains— A legacy etched in love's holy refrain.

Prayer of Thanksgiving: "In Honor of Tom Mc"

Heavenly Father, We thank You for the life of Tom McDonald Maston— a soul who taught us that joy is not bound by speech, and love is not measured by strength.

Thank You for the Maston family, whose devotion reflected Your heart, whose care was a living parable of Christlike compassion. In their home, we saw the gospel lived out— a table of welcome, a sanctuary of grace.

We praise You for the smile that preached louder than words, for the spirit that soared beyond limitation, for the testimony of a life embraced, not hidden.

May we learn from Tom Mc's radiant joy, to see beauty in brokenness, to honor every life as sacred, and to love without condition.



Let our own tables be open, our hearts be tender, and our hands be ready to serve.

In the name of Jesus, who sees every soul with perfect love, Amen.
